Lane Reduction on 4th Street

Colorado Avenue Esplanade Project

Description: *Lanes Reduced on 4th Street*

Dear Neighbor,

Reconstructing the Colorado Avenue/4th Street intersection requires the temporary reduction of northbound and southbound lanes on 4th Street between Broadway and the I-10 freeway. These closures will begin Monday, February 15.

Because there will be fewer lanes for northbound traffic, left-turns will be temporary prohibited from 4th Street to westbound Colorado Avenue. We anticipate this restriction lasting for 30 days.

In anticipation of these lane reductions, the City and contractor have completed the realignment of 2nd Street and Main Street—now open to two way traffic. We encourage you to use alternative routes shown on the map on the reverse side.

Fortunately, Santa Monica Place parking structures 7 and 8 can be reached via Main Street/2nd Street. Parking Structure 7 can be reached by making a left turn from northbound 4th Street to westbound Broadway. Parking Structure 8 can be reached by traveling north on Main Street/2nd Street.

Detours Around 4th Street:

Motorists traveling west on the I-10 can exit on 5th Street and take 5th Street to Broadway. When exiting the I-10, drivers can also turn left on 4th Street and travel west on Olympic Drive to northbound Main Street.

Things to Know:

- Beginning Monday, February 15, 4th Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction between Broadway and the I-10 freeway.
- Left turns will be prohibited from 4th Street to westbound Colorado Avenue.
- Use these alternative routes: 5th Street off-ramp north to Broadway; Olympic Drive west to Main Street/2nd Street.
- We anticipate this restriction lasting for 30 days.
